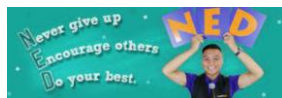

LEARNING THIS WEEK

Year 1 This week we have been busy learning about fractions. We folded shapes into halves and quarters, making sure we always had equal parts and we found a half and a quarter of a number using counters. We also looked at the art work of Henri Matisse and created our own plant pictures using colourful paper. Thank you again to all those that came to see our assembly, I hope you enjoyed it.

Year 2 have been very dramatic this week, using freeze frames and explore and retell the story of Saul's conversion. The children really immersed themselves in the story and embodied the characters impressively.

Year 3 children have now finished a Coding project using ‘Scratch’ - a free program online. The project involved choosing or creating suitable backdrops and sprites, creating simple algorithms to make an object move, giving some facts about Canada and putting in a sound effect if possible. The children should have been given a sticker which will have their details on to allow you to have a look!

Year 4 This week, Year 4 have been continuing to work on all things islands! We used drama techniques to imagine what it would be like to be marooned on a desert island; have planned and written our own desert island descriptive setting; and finally, painted our 3D papier mache islands too! With all of our island adventures this week, we are definitely in need of our half term break!

Year 5 This week in Year 5, we have gone deeper into our base 10 system - exploring numbers to 3 decimal places. In Science, we are reviewing the results of our thermal insulation experiment - was the test a fair one?! In English, we have completed our letter inspired by the Highwayman poem and have produced paintings of : *The moon was a ghostly galleon tossed upon cloudy seas. The road was a ribbon of moonlight over the purple moor.*

NB On the morning of the first Monday back, Year 5 will be celebrating Mass at the Cathedral - more details to come in an email.

Year 6 This week the Year 6 children have all worked very hard with completing their hats. The children thoroughly enjoyed Wednesday's Hat Show and it was wonderful to see so many thoughtful and detailed designs.
