LEARNING THIS WEEK

Year 1 This week in our "Amazing Animals" topic, Year 1 have been learning how to identify reptiles. We can remember so many facts about them. We had a visit from a real reptile on Thursday afternoon. It was George the Tortoise! We were all so excited to find out about him and stroke his hard, dry, shell and scaly legs! He is nearly 100 years old! In maths we have been practising telling the time to the nearest half hour and we have been identifying different coins and how much they are worth. In art we have created some beautiful Kenyan landscapes inspired by Martin Bulinya. Year 3 We have been practising our 4 and 8 times tables recently. Do you know these tables well enough to answer any question about them using multiplication and division - or any related question ideally within 5 seconds? If you are all confident in your family, perhaps you could have a speed guiz to see who is the guickest! It would be really helpful if you could point out any occasions during the next week when you are using your tables to your child/children - to help show when they are useful in 'real-life'.
