

## Learning this week

**Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have written a thank you prayer to God for our beautiful world and made lanterns to remind us that God created the light: "Let there be light and the light was good". We've learnt to count sets of ten accurately and made our own number track to 10 in maths. And we have started our topic all about Norwich; focusing on land use in Norwich and around our school.

**Year 2** received a huge surprise last week: A massive spider named Sid came to visit us but he had a problem. Everybody he met seemed to not like him so we agreed to help by becoming spider experts to convince everyone that they are truly amazing and not always terrifying! We have learned facts and practiced writing different types of sentence.

Year 3 had a fantastic trip to Norwich Castle this week to learn all about the Vikings. We met a market trader who showed us lots of different Viking artefacts. The children got to examine the objects and tried to work out what they might have been used for. We met a story teller who told us the story of how the Vikings came to England, the children got to decide whether to invade and then acted out being on the longship. We also got to make some Viking jewellery and listen to an archaeologist. The children were beautifully behaved and thoroughly enjoyed their day. What a great start to our new topic!

Year 4 It has been lovely getting to know our Year 4 pupils as they have made new friends in their classes. They have settled into the year group routines with ease and smiles on their faces - well done everyone! Polite reminder: PE is on Wednesdays & Fridays and children must be wearing the correct kit (please see the school website for more details)

**Year 5** This week we have started our topic, 'Our Green Planet' and have explored the importance of green plants to life on earth. In English, we have created a descriptive poem which asks 'What is green?' and in Maths, we have been exploring mathematical structures (that stay the same even when the numbers change) and number relationships that we can build on. In RE, we have learnt about life for the Israelites enslaved in Egypt.

**Year 6** have begun the year by writing poems about their favourite places, looking at biomes in Geography and place value in Maths. They have shown positive engagement in class discussions.
